



MCBR Good Neighbor Program

What: The MCBR Good Neighbor Program is a volunteer incentive program. For every hour spent volunteering in the community in the month between Membership Meetings, members will get one (1) entry into a prize drawing. The drawing will take place at the Membership Meeting following the time frame hours were submitted.

How: Members track the amount of time they volunteer for a 501(c)3 non-profit organization in between Membership Meetings. Members send their total hours to the AE by noon the day prior to the Membership meeting.

The AE will track members volunteer hours throughout the year. At the December Awards Banquet/Meeting, the member with the most volunteer hours for the year will win a Volunteer of the Year award.

Rewards: Members who are drawn to receive a prize at a Membership Meeting will have the ability to pick a \$25 gift card, or a free Membership Meeting meal to be used within 12 months. Each monthly winner will get their picture taken and posted on both the MCBR public and private Facebook pages, as well as in the next Monday Update.

The member with the most volunteer hours in the year will receive a Volunteer of the Year plaque at the December Membership Meeting.

Anyone who completes volunteer hours during the year will have the opportunity to apply (or be nominated) for the MCBR Good Neighbor Award. Applications will be due Nov. 30th of each year. The Good Neighbor Award nominees will be judged in December and the winner will be announced in January. The Volunteer of the Year will automatically be entered as a nominee for the Good Neighbor Award. The award for the Good Neighbor winner is still TBD.

The winner of the MCBR Good Neighbor Award will be submitted to NAR Good Neighbor Award Contest in May of the following year. 5 national winners are picked each year. National winners get tremendous national publicity, and will receive a \$10,000 grant for a 501(C)3 non-profit of their choice.
